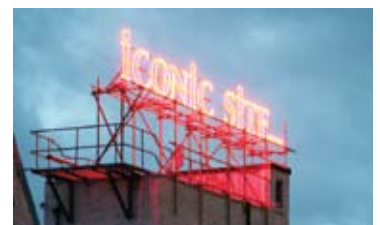
Now in its 15th year this major national conference provides the leading forum for discussion about the key elements that go into creating a vibrant and well utilised public realm.
